



911 Addressing System

North Side = Even Address, directional of "W"
South Side = Odd Address, directional of "W"
East Side = Even Address, directional of "N"
West Side = Even Address, directional of "N"

Addresses:

- Traveling West, the address numbers will get larger.
- Traveling East, the address numbers will get smaller.
- Traveling North, the address numbers will get larger.
- Traveling South, the address numbers will get smaller.
- The North side of the road is numbered with even numbers and a directional of "W".
- The South side of the road is numbered with odd numbers and a directional of "W".
- The East side of the road is numbered with odd numbers and a directional of "N".
- The West side of the road is numbered with even numbers and a directional of "N".

The addressing grid that is the basis for the Shawano County Uniform Addressing System originates in the Southeast corner of the county and extends out toward the Northwest corner of the county. The grid is similar to an X/Y coordinate system.
